The Rites of Christian Burial in the Catholic Church are meant to show Jesus' very presence to you.

The Vigil or "Wake" allows you and your family and friends to tell stories about your deceased loved one, to pray together, and relax in the loving presence of Jesus.

The Mass of Christian Burial commends your loved one to Almighty God, united to the one sacrifice of Jesus on the cross, and offers us Holy Communion, even now, as a foretaste of the banquet feast of Heaven.

The Rite of Committal or burial, returns your loved one to the earth from which humans were formed to await the glorious day of resurrection when death will be no more.

Please know that we will continue to pray for and support you through our prayers for your loved one.

8. SCRIPTURE READINGS

See Appendix "A" At all times of the Liturgical Year, you may select *at minimum* one reading from the Old or New Testament, one Responsorial Psalm and one Gospel Reading.

Alternatively, you may choose one Old Testament Reading, one Responsorial Psalm, one New Testament Reading and one Gospel Reading.

During the Easter Season (from Easter Sunday through Pentecost) you have the option to select one Reading from the Acts of the Apostles or the Book of Revelation, one Responsorial Psalm, one New Testament Reading and one Gospel Reading.

10. Musical Selections for the Liturgy See Appendix "B"

Musical selections are based on the hymnals available in the Cardinal Rigali Center Chapel. All music must be liturgical in nature. Secular music such as pop-tunes or Irish folk songs are more appropriately used at the Wake or Graveside. Please seclect (1) Processional Song, (1) Offertory Song, (1) Communion Song, and (1) Closing Song. According to the Roman Missal, the prescribed hymn for the Procession to the Place of Committal is *In Paradisum/ May the Angels Lead you into Paradise*. An alternate hymn may be selected from the listing, if you so choose.

Note Regarding the Song of Farewell



Please be aware that although there are many songs titled "Song of Farewell" in various hymnals used by other parishes, many do not adhere to the prescribed text. In addition, the arrangement set to Londonderry Air because of the tune's long standing association with the Irish Folk Song 'Danny Boy' is not permitted at this point in the liturgy and is more appropriately sung at the Wake Service or at the Graveside.
